As the kids long to be back in their beds and with their friends, we keep reminding them that at least we are doing more than scooping poop and taking care of animals. This time has been a blessing, time our children won't forget.



So, what else have we been doing? School, school and more school. As we have been homeschooling this year, it's been a lot of fun to truly be engaged with what the kids are learning day-by-day. We try to finish curriculum learning in the morning, but we realize even more now, that life is education. There are learning opportunities all day long and its fun connecting what they

Ariel, Gisselle, and their two children are currently living in Argentina, but were able to come and experience the snow for the first time. It was fun to experience the winter with some who had never seen it before. Abner then traveled to Miami with them, for a conference for a couple days.
