After a week in Orlando with 31 Arealvos, we finally made it back to Tegucigalpa and have been doing errands, unpacking, moving bedrooms around, getting ready to homeschool for another year, and trying to transition back gracefully. It’s amazing how much people and places change after a whole year

away. Praise the Lord that the kids are still enjoying being back in their “home” country. I realized how much more Honduran they were when we got to the U.S., but after being there a year, they have become a little bit more “gringo.” As Keila reminded me one day on the way to the airport, “This really isn’t our home, right mommy. Our home is in heaven with Jesus.” She is so right!



While we were in Texas, back in February, we had a pastor there who called us the morning after we had met with him who wanted to pray for us. While he was praying for us, the Lord showed him that once we stepped foot off the plane, God was going to begin to accelerate the purposes and plans that He had for us and position us in the right places with the right contacts in order for His plans to be completed. Within this first week of being back, one of the things that we saw the Lord do was move Abner from being the local worship leader, to being the national worship pastor over the association of churches. Abner’s heart for this nation together with what he’s been learning through 10,000 Fathers worship school, we believe it will impact not only Honduras today, but also for the generations to come. Pray for God to give clarity and wisdom, His unique design revealed to Abner as he becomes a father to the worship leaders here.
